Positive Youth Development Training for Working with Today's High Risk Youth

Much of today's debate on reaching high-risk youth vacillates between punishing behavior and treating disorders, both of which are deficit models. This address looks at a strength-based approach for today's most difficult youth, which focuses upon: the strength of the adult-child bond, the strength of the individual youth, and the strength of the community.

Working with Gang Members

There are currently more than 1.6 million active gang members in the United States. The numbers have risen 40% since 2009 making it a serious threat in most communities. This workshop addresses the underlying contributing factors to gang numbers increasing as well as preventative and intervention strategies for reducing those numbers.

Strength-Based Discipline with Youth

How does one build on the strengths of youth while still addressing destructive behavior patterns? This seminar presents several best practice methods for turning problems into opportunities for transformational growth from Scott Larson's book "The Resilience Revolution."

Resolving Conflict in Ways that Transform

We avoid conflict, because in the vast majority of cases, relationships are further damaged as a result. In fact, only 15% of the time is the relationship strengthened as a result of the conflict. This seminar presents a model that gives more opportunities for that 15% of cases.

Impacting Youth Toward Transformation

Transformation means "to become what one has never been." This workshop presents several transformational change principles for working with all types of youth based upon Scott Larson's 20+ years of experience and his book "The Resilience Revolution."

New Paradigms for Reaching At-Risk Youth

Young people are worlds apart from the teens of two or three decades ago. Hence, many of our old approaches are also outdated and ineffective. For example, we used to think of troubled kids as being *alienated* from society. But many of today's youth are better described by the term *anemic*, defined as "a social instability resulting from an absence of standards and values or a sense of dislocation." Many of our most troubled youth have never been attached, thus the idea of rehabilitating them to their former state is irrelevant. This message looks at what we as educators, concerned citizens, and parents can do to intervene in the lives of today's troubled young people.

ABOUT THE PRESENTER

Dr. Scott Larson is president and founder of *Straight Ahead Ministries*, an international faith-based organization working with juvenile offenders in more than 400 juvenile detention centers in 15 states and five countries with a myriad of aftercare programs when youth return home. Straight Ahead also provides mentoring programs and aftercare homes for youth after release from lock-up. The Larsons opened and lived in one of these aftercare homes with up to seven boys for nine years. Scott was the chairman of the board of Reclaiming Youth International, a strength-based movement that provided training and best practice models to programs serving high-risk youth around the world. Scott has authored 13 books on working effectively with troubled youth and has been a speaker to youth, parents, teachers, social workers, and youth workers since 1983 and is an adjunct professor at Gordon-Conwell Theological Seminary's Center for Urban Ministerial Education (CUME), as well as professor and founder of Juvenile Justice Ministries at Gordon College in Wenham, MA. Scott and his wife Hanne reside in Northborough, Massachusetts.
