MODULES FOR PRESENTATIONS

Recovering from Loss, Moving through Grief

This workshop or keynote is designed to address the needs of participants who have lost a child or a significant person in their life. The participants will have an opportunity to address the dynamics of loss and grief, and understand how to move through the stages of grief. The participants will also be equipped to understand how to get back in the stride of life.

Drugships: How Kids Build Relationships with Chemical Use

Participants will explore a relational understanding of kids' enchantment with chemical use and learn how to reach youth whose connections with chemical use are more powerful than human bonds. Dr. Chambers of Stronghold Counseling Services leads and investigation of how to facilitate recovery of a drugship divorce.

Kid Whispering Tactics/The Inside Kid

Participants will examine the impact of trauma and disappointment on our youth. Defiant youth outwit adults with strategies of fight, flight and fool. Dr. Chambers describes how to understand the "private logic" of adult-wary youth, thus helping participants decode the youth's troubling behavior and begin replacing hostile, resistant encounters with respectful alliances.

Life Space Crisis Intervention: An Overview

Traditional crisis intervention relies on de-escalation, restraint, exclusion, and zero tolerance to manage volatile behavior. Such methods may establish order, but these interventions alone do not help youth correct their chronic patterns of self-defeating behavior. Youth professionals are now being challenged to develop positive behavioral interventions. Dr. Chambers presents an overview of Life Space Crisis Intervention that provides the next generation of advanced reclaiming skills to enable professionals to move beyond a narrow dependence on containment, coercion and exclusion.

Overcoming Chronic Family Conflict

In this session, Dr. Chambers focuses on the impact that chronic family conflict and parents' alcoholic behavior can have on children.
